

Ourhistory

FERNE ANIMAL SANCTUARY WAS FOUNDED BY THE LATE NINA, DUCHESS OF HAMILTON & BRANDON AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR





The Duchess realised that, at the time, many service men and women would be leaving for duty and would be unable to take their pets with them. An appeal was put out on the BBC's National Service asking for suitable homes for the animals. On her return home the Duchess found several dogs, cats and a parrot waiting for her. The animals needing new homes were kindly taken in by people living on the Duchess' estate in Dorset. Inevitably, at the end of the war many owners failed to return to collect their pets and so the story of Ferne Animal Sanctuary began.





Today, Ferne is set in 52 acres of glorious Somerset countryside, high in the Blackdown Hills. In 1975, the Sanctuary moved to its present premises which overlooks the River Yarty Valley. Any animal passing through Ferne's gate can be assured of love and compassion throughout the rest of its life.
